- What age or grade level are students?

- Are students English language learners?
- Are students from low socioeconomic backgrounds?

Consider your community's values.

- Is succeeding in this challenge something that community stakeholders (students, families, school / district staff, board members) care strongly about?

What resources are available to support you in successfully implementing?

- Do you have time built into your schedule to conduct an intervention or add a program?
- Would you be able to apply for additional funding if you need materials?
- Do you have an instructional coach, mentor, or team willing to collaborate with you?

Consider reaching out to the researchers and requesting additional support, such as explanations or summaries in plain language and related materials (such as lesson plans, checklists, or student materials).
